Merit retention of justices and judges

All voters in Okaloosa and Walton Counties will see the Supreme Court justices and 1st District Court of Appeals judges who are up for merit retention this year.

One of the best metaphors for our Supreme Court justices and Appeals Court judges is that they are Florida's referees. It is not their job to root for one team or litigant over the other or to bring their personal ideology to their role. They are there to interpret the law.

Under judicial merit retention, the justices and appeals judges appear on the ballot in staggered terms. This year's election provides voters the opportunity to review three

Supreme Court justices. Voters covered by the 1st District Court of Appeals will also see four appeals judges on the ballot.

They all reached their positions originally after being carefully screened by Judicial Nominating Committees and appointed by Florida governors in a process known as judicial merit selection, so they are already vetted.

Research suggests many Florida voters are unclear of what judicial merit retention means. Often, they skip this section of the ballot. We urge you to vote the entire ballot.

Be prepared. Be informed. Be a voter!

As you prepare to vote, be sure to check out the information at <http://www.lwvokaloosa.org/E-votergeneral2012/2012E-voter.html> in the E-Voter. For the first time we included Walton County races, since there is no League there and voters have limited resources.

We included links to candidate websites wherever available so you can do more in-depth research. We

especially urge you to prepare in advance for the eleven proposed constitutional amendments that will appear on the ballot. They are complex and will require some thought **before** Election Day.

Don't be that guy who walks into the precinct and keeps everyone waiting while he reads the ballot for the first time. **Be prepared. Be informed. Be a voter!**

WSRE Rally 2012: General Election Edition

You'll have to watch the first half hour of each night's program to see the races that apply to Okaloosa County. The three-way race for

U.S. Congress District 1 is the first item on the 25 October program, and the two-way race for Okaloosa County Commission District 1 is the first item on the 26 October program.

Be sure to watch both, because the new Congressional district encompasses all of Okaloosa County, and our county commissioners are elected at large.

Legislative Priorities for 2013

The 2013 legislative session begins on March 5th, and we are already preparing. Our lobbyist and members in Tallahassee follow all the issues of interest to League, but due to limited resources, we always prioritize. Local Leagues across Florida submitted recommendations for the upcoming session, and here are the top three priorities:

- Government in Florida
- Social Policy in Florida
- Education in Florida

The count was extremely close, and members expressed interest in a number of areas. These included strengthening the Florida Commission on Ethics, campaign finance

Everyone knows about incumbent President Barack Obama and former Governor Mitt Romney. Did you know that 10 other parties qualified to put their nominees on the Florida ballot? In addition, there are six sets of write-in candidates.

LWVUS has also prepared a Voters' Guide to the presidential candidates who met the following criteria:

- The candidate must have made a public announcement of her/his intention to run for President;
- The candidate must qualify for

reform and Sunshine laws; restoring education funding for K-College; ending unfunded mandates for schools; implementing the Affordable Care Act and supporting women's rights. Most Leaguers are also concerned about water quality and water conservation.

The next step will be visiting our legislators to let them know how we feel about these issues and find out where they stand. Where will you be on Election Day?

If you'll be away from your polling place due to travel, work, school or other reasons, you'll need to take advantage of early voting or cast an absentee ballot to vote.

Voting brings us together as Americans – **it is the one time when we are all equal.** It doesn't matter if you're rich or poor, young or old, liberal or conservative; Election Day is your opportunity to support your community and have a say in America's future. Voting allows you to have an impact on these critical issues and the policies that will be debated in the coming years, so if you or a loved one needs to vote early or request an absentee ballot to vote this year, take action **now**.

the ballot in enough states to win a majority of electoral votes; and,

- The candidate must meet the Presidential Election Campaign Fund Act's minimum contribution threshold requirements for qualifying for matching funds as of October 1, 2012.

Responses were received from all four Presidential candidates who met the criteria. These include: Gary Johnson (Libertarian), Barack Obama (D), Mitt Romney (R) and Jill Stein (Green).
